



What's Alps Tour?

The Alps Tour, part of the Satellite Tour (3rd level), has been created to give young professionals the opportunity to play and to get a category on the European Challenge Tour or/as well as exemptions from Stage 1 of the European Tour Qualifying School.

How to play Alps Tour tournaments?

To enter a tournament, you must either have a category on Alps Tour or get a wild card.

Who has a category for 2010 Alps Tour season?

1. 2009 Alps Tour full members according to their 2009 results.
2. Players who qualified in 2009 Alps Tour Qualifying School.

How to get a wild card?

Are you from Austria, Belgium, France, Italy, Morocco, Slovenia, Spain ?

⇒ You may contact your representative (see list below)

Are you member of another PGA?

⇒ You may ask either the event Promoter, the Representative of the country host of the tournament or the Alps Tour Director for a wild card.

How do I know if I received a wild card?

Wild cards are usually given the day after the closing date of entries, that means about 13 days prior to the tournament.

If you've got a wild card, you will receive as soon as possible an email from the Alps Tour office to confirm you're invited.

How to obtain a category for the 2011 season?

1. A qualifying school is held every year, usually in November. Date and venue are announced on our website www.alpstourgolf.com during summer.
2. Full members of the Alps Tour who compete in a minimum of 6 events in 2010 season, in 3 different countries and finishing in the Top 50 of the final 2010 Order of Merit will automatically get a category for 2011 season.

How to become a Full Member of the Alps Tour?

1. You are member of a PGA recognized by the European Tour or the PGA of Europe
2. You complete the 2010 Membership form
3. You pay the membership fee of 350 euros

Please note that being Alps Tour full member does not mean that you've got a category and an exemption status!



What's the advantage of being a Full Member of the Alps Tour?

1. If you compete in a minimum of 6 Alps Tour events in 3 different countries and finish in the Top 50 for the 2010 season, you will be eligible for a category in 2011 Alps Tour season.
2. If you finish in Top 5 for the 2010 season, you will obtain a Challenge Tour category (category 10) for the 2011 season

Please note that being a Full Member of the Alps Tour does not mean that you have a category and does not mean that you are eligible for tournaments.

Fees

- ⇒ 2010 Membership fee: 350 euros
- ⇒ 2010 Entry fee: 85 euros / tournament for Alps Tour members
120 euros for other players
